GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR MENTOR-MENTEE RELATIONSHIP

The mentor-mentee relationship can be an invaluable one for both the parties, the mentor as well as the mentee. The mentor's role is to teach, guide and help to shape the professional growth and learning of the mentee and to serve as a positive role model. The mentee's role is to seek guidance and constructive feedback on his/her academic pursuits and professional development and career goals. However, to make the relationship work, each party needs to understand the role they play.

The role of the mentor is to act as:

- Advisor and coach: A mentor should provide advice, guidance and feedback. He/ she
 must be a patient listener and approachable. He/ she should listen to both what is
 being said and how it is being said. Mentor must offer constructive and meaningful
 advice to the mentee. They can share their experience and expertise and also act as a
 sounding board for ideas and action plans.
- Champion and cheerleader: The mentor must offer encouragement and support to try new things. They can help the mentees move out their comfort zones. The mentors can also celebrate milestones and achievements with mentee.
- Resource and recommendations: the mentor can identify resources that will help the mentees with personal development and growth, such as recommending books, references or other learning tools. They can also encourage mentees to join seminars and workshops too.
- Devil's advocate and Confidante: It should be the duty of the mentor to provide the tough feedback that mentees need to hear in order to move forward. They need to push the mentees to take risks when appropriate. Lastly, The mentor must maintain confidentiality at all times. They should develop mutual trust and respect.

Mentees too have their own responsibilities:

- Mentee must maintain the time and regular contact with the mentor.
- Mentee must assess his/ her academic/ professional strengths, learning and developmental needs, values and short and long term goals. The mentee must develop a plan with the mentor for achieving these goals.
- He/ she must share openly with the mentor his successes and failures.
- He/ she must always be receptive to feedback and coaching. The mentee must take advantage of the opportunities presented by the mentor.
